4 scales of justice that form a square.



Four-faced shape of logo – justice has to be distributed fairly without influence of bias, privilege or corruption.

The words <u>LEGAL</u> and <u>AID</u> give the understanding of providing legal representation to low-income people.

The word MALTA is used to identify the Agency in the international arena.

Procedure for applying (1)

In Criminal cases

 Defandant applying for legal aid can apply according to Article 570 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Procedure for applying (2)

In Civil cases

- Applicant to call at Legal Aid Office to be means tested whether the person is eligible for legal aid.
- To provide the relevant documents:
- a) Social security document stating amount of income;
- b) FS3 from employer;
- c) Bank statements;
- d) Other documents re income and possessions.

If the person is eligible for legal aid an appointment is scheduled with the Head Advocate to discuss the issues.

Procedure for applying (3)

As a victim of crime

 The applicant is scheduled for an appointment with Head Advocate to discuss the issue.

Day of appointment with Head Advocate (1)

- The person meets Head Advocate to discuss the issue and see whether there are sufficient grounds for proceedings (Art. 912 (a) of Chp 12).
- If there are sufficient grounds for a person to be granted legal aid assistance (to take or defend, continuing or being part of a proceeding) an application (*rikors*) is drawn up to be presented at the Court Registries.

Day of appointment with Head Advocate (2)

 Application (in civil procedures) (LN 62 of 2016) is filled by the client and confirmed on oath by the beneficiary at the Legal Aid office.

The application (rikors) is presented on the following day/s
to the duty judge on roster to decree if the demand is
conceded or otherwise.

Assigned Legal Aid Lawyer and Legal Procurator

In Criminal Cases

 When a person asks for a Legal Aid lawyer in the Court of Magistrates, s/he is assigned a lawyer on the daily Criminal Court rota.

Assigned Legal Aid Lawyer and Legal Procurator (2)

In Civil Cases

- After the Court decrees that the person is to be granted a legal aid lawyer, the Court Registry informs the LAM Agency with the name of lawyer and Legal Procurator for every application according to the Civil Court rota.
 - Legal Aid Malta Agency informs every lawyer and legal procurator with the cases they are assigned and the relevant scanned documents are forwarded.
 - The beneficiary for legal aid is informed with the name of the lawyer, legal procurator and their mobile numbers (through SMS, email or telephone). Client is informed that s/he has to make contact with their assigned lawyer.

Further information (2)

- Lawyers and PL are appointed directly by the Minister Articles 89 & 911(6) of Chapter 12 (COCP) and their names are published in the Government Gazette.
- Head Advocate of Legal Aid is also CEO of Agency.
 Appointed following a call for applications and his name is also published in the Government Gazette.
