

Call for Human Rights Interns

aditus foundation is an independent, voluntary and non-profit organisation established with a mission to **monitor, act and report** on access to fundamental human rights. Our work includes advocacy, research, capacity building and provision of legal aid.

aditus foundation is also Secretariat to the Platform of Human Rights Organisations in Malta ([PHROM](#)), Malta's first and only network of human rights NGOs.

We are seeking to recruit, on a full- or part-time basis, a **Human Rights Intern**. Depending on profiles and availabilities, we could consider engaging up to two **Human Rights Interns**. The positions are for a period of not less than **4 months**, with commencement dates to be discussed. Although future employment possibilities are not excluded, no commitment to this effect can be made.

Regrettably, we are unable to offer payment for the internship, but a daily transport and lunch allowance is provided for days worked. Furthermore, we strive to offer all our interns an all-round experience to the same extent as staff members. This includes regular participation in overseas trainings, conference and meetings. We are also able to provide supporting information and documentation for funding applications, under schemes such as EVS, ERASMUS+, etc.

The **Human Rights Interns** will be full and active members of our dynamic team, with tasks generally including:

- Daily media review and compilation;
- PHROM's [Il-Librerija](#) data management;
- Thematic research supporting our [FRANET](#) Research Team;
- Logistical and other support for projects being implemented;
- Active input in our regular Team Meetings;
- Visits to places of concern to us;
- Participation at conferences, trainings and seminars;
- Support our Shadow Reporting activities;
- General research and compilation;
- Administrative tasks.

Prospective candidates should:

- Be in possession of a University degree in a field related to or including human rights;
- Be knowledgeable of or familiar with key human rights instruments (e.g. United Nations core treaties, EU Charter for Fundamental Rights, European Convention on Human Rights, etc.);
- Have excellent computing skills. Applicants with knowledge of IT tools required to make creative use of data and information (info-graphics, design, etc.) will be preferred;
- Have an understanding of and agreement with the organisations' guiding principles;
